Ewing Green Team members Dave Byers and Joanne Mullowney have worked up a landscape plan for the north and south entrances at the Municipal Complex. It will be a first step of the Beautify Ewing Campaign, identified by Community Visioning attendees last year as an action to be pursued.

LIVING LOCAL EXPO

The Living Local Expo will be held on Saturday, March 28th from 11 – 4 at the NJ National Guard Armory on Eggerts Crossing Road. Ewing has been participating since the start of this year's planning. At present, eighty exhibitors are scheduled to participate. In addition to the preparatory work done by EGT members during the planning stages, the EGT will also have a table to promote our activities. We will be running our EnviroWheel, handing out seed packets of milkweed seed appropriate for the local area, and advertising the ***Is It Time to Go Nuclear?*** presentation. Ewing contributed to speakers to the event. Lee Farnham reported on how Project FeederWatch documents the movement of feeder birds around the country and how participating in FeederWatch helps preserve the natural environment on a local, state and national basis, by increasing knowledge about what birds are seen at feeders, and with what frequency. Joe Mirabella also gave a much shortened version of his upcoming nuclear power presentation. Sponsors include PSE&G (thank you, Mark Wetherbee!), NRG, Terhune Orchards, Mrs. G's, Advanced Solar Products, Community Green Energy, EnviroPhysics, and Princeton Air. Volunteers will be needed to cover the tables.

BIKE ADVOCACY

Joanne and Michael will be meeting with Ewing Business Administrator Jim McManimon about the proposed bike tour of Ewing in addition to other agenda items from the Community Visioning.

ENERGY

John and the energy team are working on a number of the energy actions identified during the Community Visioning, including setting up for Residential Energy Audit for Ewing homeowners.

COMMUNITY EDUCATION AND OUTREACH

Joe Mirabella will be giving a presentation "Is it time to go Nuclear?" in April during Earth Week. He has easily put in over 100 hours in preparation for the event.

2014 COMMUNITY VISIONING

The group decided that an appropriate expenditure of some of the remaining grant funds to attempt to communicate the Community Visioning results to as many Township residents as possible. It was

In addition, we will ask Administration for permission to post a display of our Community Visioning results at the Municipal Building, the ESCC, and Hollowbrook to further publicize the results.
