FEATURED PROGRAM

Joseph Mirabella gave a presentation on Nuclear Energy in New Jersey, including a history of nuclear energy and science. He discussed the current issue of PSE&G asking for \$320 Million dollars to subsidize 3 nuclear Power plants. This factors into about \$3.40 month per tax payer and equals approximately \$300 million per year. NY State also subsidized nuclear for about \$500 Mil.

Does the EGT support this? General consensus is 'yes.' In addition, Governor Murphy said with this approval he wants subsidies to help solar and wind, and other sources of alternate power
