## SPECIAL GUEST SPEAKER BIO

Susan Bristol, from The Watershed, Stormwater Water Policy, joined The Watershed Institute in 2023 where she serves as the Municipal Policy Specialist. Prior to that, she worked as a Professional Architect and Planner at her own practice, SPB Architecture LLC. Susan has worked at NJIT in Newark as an educator in the School of Architecture where she created the award-winning Garden State Studios. Susan is passionate about the environment, is an avid reader and loves being on or in the water. She has a B.S. Arch. and an M. Arch degree from the University of Virginia where, in addition to her Architecture major, she studied Landscape & Urban Design. Susan is a NJ licensed Architect and Planner and a certified LEED AP in green design. When not at the Watershed, Susan can be found serving her municipality of Rocky Hill as councilwoman and volunteer.

Susan came to update the EGT and guests on stormwater policies, regulations, and groundbreaking legislation. Ewing needs an updated storm water ordinance by July. Our last update was in 2020, but the NJDEP has updated its requirements since that time and the ordinance needs to be revisited.

A separate storm sewer system is any conveyance that transports storm runoff directly to a receiving stream. In addition to the inlets and pipes we associate with storm sewers, it also includes curbing, swales, ditches, channels, etc. With current regulations we have more opportunities to work regionally, i.e. we could join efforts with Lawrence or Hopewell and increase our impact. Mercer County also has a great planning department and may be a helpful resource for working regionally rather than just individual municipalities. Problems reported



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from outside Ewing – comes from other towns that affect our jurisdiction. Like Ewing's filters down to Trenton.

As per the new NJDEP regs, all NJ municipalities are required to not only regulate the activities of developers, but to manage their own stormwater systems in such a way as not to pollute our streams. The updated Municipal Separate Storm Sewer System (MS4) regulations also require an active public participation and education component in the program.

MS4 areas have their own plans which need to redefine major developments, address small developments, address redevelopment, low impact design, and incorporate water quality. The Watershed Institute can help with guidance and monitoring.

Susan Bristol recommended reaching out to Michael Pisauro, the Policy Director, at the Watershed. She suggested that Dave Schroth, our Council member attending this meeting, reach out for guidance for Ewing's officials moving forward. We also need to consider updating our zoning and master plans to incorporate the new changes.

There is webpage on the Ewing Township's website on Stormwater Management. It offers very helpful background on many of the subjects we heard about tonight.

### ANJEC MEMBERSHIP

## NJ SALT WATCH UPDATE (THRU THE WATERSHED)

Our goal is to collect a water sample from each site before and after a snow or bad weather event (ice). Test results will be entered into the NJ Watershed Watch Network. (Joanne, Mark, Karen, and Evan volunteered.) Evan has the instructions and can coordinate with Karen before and after rain/snow event. The data collection needs to be completed by the end of April.
