#### SUSTAINABLE JERSEY

Ewing has currently earned Bronze status from our February submission [Submitted 225 points/195 approved]. We can add new actions mid-May and have another opportunity in July, but Township Management feels Bronze is enough for now, Township staff have a lot on their plates, not much time to write up and submit more actions at this point

#### TREES

Annual Arbor Day celebration is scheduled for Saturday, April 26th, at 9:00am. Each Green Team member donates \$20 for a tree. Can pay via check, or Venmo [Evan to set that up]. Township will donate three trees, perhaps Police Benevolent Assoc will donate another. Planting to take place at Municipal Center walking track, to replace Ash trees that were taken down due to Ash borer. Green Team has goal of obtaining Tree City USA status [we already spend \$2 per capita on trees which qualifies us for this status].

Suggest change the % of native plants required for new construction. It is now 40%. The recommended number is 70%.
